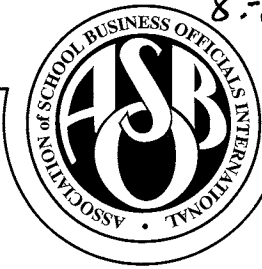

Whereas

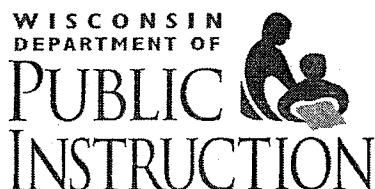

