#### Hall of Fame – Class of 2011 Female Athletes

##### Kelly Miller – Monroe (1976-1980)

Kelly's high school coaches were Howie Jubeck and Dick Glendenning. A pioneer for girls athletics, Kelly won three individual WIAA State Championships setting records in the 110yd Low Hurdles (14.2) in 1978 and the 220yd Low Hurdles (28.53) in 1979. A fall in the 1980 100m LH State Meet Finals prevented a possible third championship, but she did reach the awards stand as a 3rd place finisher in the Long Jump. During her high school years of competition, Kelly set school records in 6 different events and conference records in 5 events. In 1979, Kelly was ranked 3rd in the nation by Track & Field News for the 110yd LH. In 1978, she placed 6th in this event at the Junior Olympics in Lincoln, NE, 1st in the 70yd LH at the Kansas Jayhawk Relays HS Division, and set a WIAA Beloit Regional Record by winning the Long Jump at 18' 3". Kelly went on to attend UW-Platteville before joining our ranks as a teacher and track & field coach in Texas where she currently resides.

##### Brittany (Rusch) Daly – Wausau East (1990-1994)

Brittany was coached by Tim Kostroski and Jack Synold. One of the most prolific scorers in state meet history, Brittany was the 7<sup>th</sup> female in state history to record 6 individual state titles. Her 1994 State Division I Long Jump Record of 18' 11 1/2" is a record that still stands today. In addition to state titles in the long jump in 1993 and 1994, Brittany also won the 100m and 200m Dash events each year as well. She placed in all three of those events as a sophomore in 1992. Brittany set school indoor/outdoor records in 14 events with the most notable being an outdoor long jump of 19' 3 1/2". She was an 8-time WISTCA All-State Honoree and 1994 WISTCA Female Athlete of the Year. Brittany's national honors include qualifying for the Golden West Invitational and US Junior National meets, and she was 1994 High School All-American in the long jump. Upon graduation, Brittany attended Miami University.

#### Male Athletes

##### Darrin Dallas Charles – Oshkosh North (1998-2001)

Darrin's high school head coaches were Tony Bolz and Steve Jorgensen. He was a member of teams that were four-time conference champions. His school records included 6' 11" in the high jump, 23' 1/4" in the long jump and 46' 6 1/2" in the triple jump. From 1999-2001, Darrin won the high jump at the WIAA State Meet with heights of 6' 7", 6' 10" & 6' 10" respectively. During those years he also added a 2nd place finish in the long jump, two 3rd place finishes in the triple jump and a 3rd place finish in the 400m Relay.

Darrin was a 3 sport All-State Athlete participating in Football, Basketball and Track & Field. He made the WISTCA All-State list 6 times. In 2000, Darrin was selected as the WI Football Player of the Year and a receiver/defensive back on the Oshkosh North State Championship team. Darrin went on to attend UW-Madison where he was an integral player on several Badger football teams.

##### Gavin Ball – Monona Grove (1999-2003)

Gavin's high school coach was Brian Storms. As a team captain and MVP, Gavin was a 6-time conference champion and set school records of 192' 1" in the discus and 62' 2 3/4" in the shot put. At the WIAA Division II Regional/Sectional levels, he won 3 discus and 2 shot put titles. He claimed 3 individual WIAA Division II discus titles, establishing a state record of 192' 1" in 2003, claimed 2 state shot put titles and 1 runner-up finish in that event. Gavin earned 6 WISTCA All-State honors. His performances at the state meet rank him 2nd all-time in the discus and 21st in the shot put. Gavin received a full scholarship to attend the University of Kansas. He later transferred to the University of Kentucky where he earned All-SEC honors indoor & outdoor in 2005 & 2006. He won the SEC Indoor Shot Put title and qualified for the NCAA Division I Nationals in 2006. Gavin posted collegiate bests in the Shot Put (61' 2 1/4"), Discus (184' 1/4") & Javelin (178' 3").

#### Coaches

##### Richard Glendenning – Monroe (1966-Present)

A graduate of UW-Platteville & Southern IL U at Carbondale, Dick started his coaching career at Cambridge JH School in 1961, spent the next two years at Bloomington HS and the past 44 years at Monroe HS. As a head coach at Monroe, his teams won 3 Conference titles, and 14 titles while he has been an assistant there. They have claimed 1 Regional, 4 Sectional and 1 WIAA State Championship all at the Division II level during those years. Dick has had 8 individual State Meet Champions with 5 WIAA State Meet Records during his tenure as well. In addition to track and field, Dick also coached basketball for 17 years; 2 years as head coach at Bloomington and 3 years as head coach at Monroe. He was also an assistant Football coach; 2 years at Bloomington and 20 years at Monroe.

##### Dick Helling – Marathon (1965-1992)

Dick received his bachelor of Science Degree from UW-Stevens Point. He coached the Marathon High School Boys' track teams for 28 years; the first 25 as head coach and the last 3 as an assistant. During his tenure they won 13 conference championships, 15 Regional Championships, 7 Sectional Championships, 1 State Championship and 2 State Runner-ups. Nine of Dick's athletes/relay teams garnered individual championships at the state meet with one 1600m Relay setting a state meet record of 3:26.8. Through his years of coaching at Marathon, Dick was also a head wrestling coach, an assistant football and assistant basketball coach.

##### Dennis Holt – D.C. Everest (1976-2004)

Dennis graduated from UW-Madison (B.A.-1965). He began his coaching career at Burlington HS during the 1965-66 school year, followed by Reedsburg 1966-68, Manitowoc Roncalli 1968-76, and concluded his career at D.C. Everest HS from 1976-2004. Dennis' Roncalli teams won WISAA Division II State Meet titles in 1970 and 1974. While at D.C. Everest his teams won 7 outdoor, 13 relay & 11 indoor Valley Conference titles as well as numerous Regional & Sectional titles. They won 2 Division I WIAA State Championships in 1994 & 1996, with a runner-up finish in 1995. Eleven of his WIAA individual/relay participants won titles at State. Dennis also coached cross country and was part of a WIAA state title in 1965 at Burlington, and won 3 WISAA State Titles at Roncalli in 1969, 1970 & 1974. Respected by his peers, Dennis was named the WISTCA District II Coach of the year in 1987, 1989, & 1994. He was also one of the original Beginner Coaches' Series speakers at the WISTCA Clinic in 1995.
