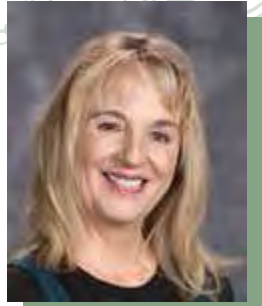


RECOGNITION OF HONORED RETIREES

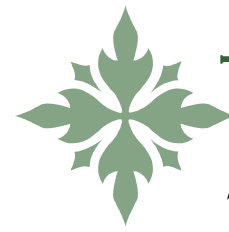


MARGARET JERZ

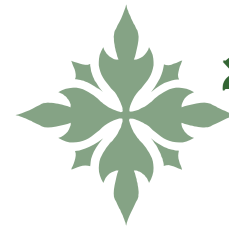
SARA JOHNSON

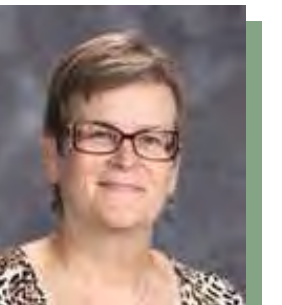
KATHLEEN MARTINO
